A LITTLE 4-H HISTORY

In 1905, Jasper L. McBrein, Nebraska's superintendent of public instruction, appointed E.C. Bishop to expand the corn growing, sewing and baking projects he had started in the New York County schools. The program led to the organization of the Nebraska Boys' Agricultural Association and the Nebraska Girls' Domestic Science Association. Clearly, the organization of boys' and girls' clubs as a means of advancing rural youth education was an idea whose time had come. The stated purpose of the Nebraska associations included a phrase that had come to symbolize the idea of agricultural clubs. Their statement of purpose read, in part, "to educate the youth of the county, town and city to a knowledge of their dependence upon nature's resources, and to the value of the fullest development of hand, head and heart...." Possibly taken from a poem by Rudyard Kipling, the phrase "hand, heart and

head" became a popular way for educators and others to express a commitment to learning and the development of young citizens.
